These national sites work best for finding general education and license requirements. For more specific information, such as salary and job availability, I recommend going to the state level dental association website. It can often provide local information for each occupation.

Also, both the ADA and DANB have compiled reports about the dental industry in areas around the U.S. Through the ADA Survey Center, you can order data on general Dental Workforce Issues, Legal Provisions for Delegating Intraoral Functions to Chairside Assistants and Dental Hygienists, and many other topics. DANB focuses on Dental Assistant issues specifically in its State Fact Booklet (order form available online at www.danb.org). In one easy-to-read guide it clearly shows each state's average salary, Board of Dentistry contact info, and requirements for employment, radiograph exposure and expanded functions, as well as much more.
