On the other hand, one that is clean, concise and complete shows someone who cares about doing a good job, and by extension, would be a good employee. Your resume needs to show you in your best light.

## **Dental Resume Builder**

Here is one tip of many that will help create that first great impression.

1. Start with your objective as your initial first impression. Writing your objective is the most important part of the resume writing process. You will want to keep in mind as you write your objective, that this is the first scanning process from the employer’s prospective. Focus on your assets and what skills and expertise you will offer that employer. Think “What can I write that will make my resume stand out from the others?”
